Deaf adults who need improve literacy skills themselves can not provide the tools and the skills their children will need to help them succeed in school. Children of deaf adults (CODA) who are functionally illiterate are 4 times more likely as their friends to be functionally illiterate.

For those deaf people whose first language is signing, learning to read and write in English constitutes learning a second language with a different grammar, lexicon, and syntax.

Deaf community member's lack of exposure to spoken language makes teaching traditional sound-letter correspondence difficult, if not impossible.

Reading gives deaf adults
a voice in their lives,
